



## **Students' selection requirements for Erasmus + grants**

## **EU-MADE4LL** project

**Project Reference: 2016-1-IT02-KA203-024087** 

For participating in the activities organized by Aarhus University and Rocca Creative Thinking from Sheffield, the students should fulfil the following requirements:

- They should be still enrolled in one of the five universities that are part of the project (i.e. AU, UNIFI, UNIME, UNITOV and UNIVLEEDS) and still be part of their study program at the time of the proposed activities.
- They should have given their consent for participating in the project (both on the project's platform and in the consent forms provided by each module leader).
- They should have received the highest grade in selected type of multimodal digital text among the submitted assignment within the same category. The final grade includes the one they received for their digital text production and analysis, and for their peer-assessment. The grades are the European ones: A, B, C, D and F as translated in the equivalent grading system of their own university.
- One student per category of text type will be selected. In case further grants are available beyond the five grants, the student with the highest grade among the five text types will be selected. In case of the latter non acceptance, the next student with the highest grade among the five text types will be selected.

## The selection process includes the following:

- 1. A ranking of the selected students for each text type will be published by each module leader on the basis of the final grade achieved for the project assignments, as confirmed following each University policy for approving grades.
- 2. If several students receive the same general grade for the same type of multimodal digital text, the assignments produced by the students will go through a second round of evaluation, but with a larger group of markers which will include the whole board of module leaders across the five universities and the final decision will be communicated to the selected students promptly.
- 3. In the absence of candidates accepting the participation in the Project's activities for one text type, the vacant position will be allocated to the one who received the highest score across all other text types.

- 4. For each text type, two students will be selected as candidates for participating in the proposed activities. The candidates are ranked in the order of their grades: the 1st with the highest grade and the 2nd with the next highest grade.
- 5. Both candidates need to inform their module leaders by an official email that s/he accepts to take part in the proposed activities **within one week** from the publication of the ranking on their university portal.

If the 1st candidate fails to send the formal acceptance within one week, the position will be offered to the 2nd candidate, who would be announced immediately. If none of these two candidates accept, then the procedure will be repeated with the next student in rank.

6. Once the student has officially accepted to participate in the mobility, and names of participants are communicated to the relevant offices and to the coordinator of the project, withdrawals will be no longer possible, as budget for participation in the proposed activities cannot be transferred to another student after official acceptance.
